HOW YOUR MONEY WILL BE USED IN 2024/5

In order to balance the books in 2024/5, a council tax rise of £13 for a Band D property, or 5.3% will be required, as well as £7.3m of savings. The graphs below show you Kent Police's income for next year and where it will be spent.
